
with such powerful machines.


Picking Winners Promotes Our Members!

than the ones we have now?

pavement! (Chesaning is working on those roads, but nothing happens overnight. Be optimistic and patient.) I love the street lights. The amber glow they give off is priceless. Picture yourself walking down these streets... what do you think you would be wearing? I'm sure the women would be wearing a long dress and the men probably a suit if they were going to town. If not a suit, they more than likely would still be sporting a hat.

The train depot looks like something out of a movie. Wouldn't it be great to sit inside and wait for a train to come and take you away for a day, or a weeks' vacation? Maybe you would be waiting for a loved one to come home from the war. Only if it was still here and if its walls could talk.

Woodrow Wilson was the President of the Unites States in 1915. During his term, World War I was going on. Germans used poison gas against the Russians. This was the first time this type of warfare was used. It was so cold in Russia; the gas was not very effective. Another first was the first transcontinental phone call. Alexander Graham Bell made a call from New York to San Francisco. A little more positive first, I would say. (Can you imagine, no smart phones?)

A few other little facts about the 1915's: Homes- The average home cost \$3,200, Car - \$2,005, Milk - .09 a quart, Gas - .15 a gallon, Bread - .07, Stamp - .02! To support these expenses the average income was \$687 a year. Women made half the income as men.

Boy, have we come a long way! I love the history, love the facts, but I think I like all the progress we have made over the years. Would I like to spend a day there? Absolutely! Who knows, maybe our great grandkids will invent a time machine, and they will laugh at our smart phones.
